2014 Christmas Ham Sales - Gil Hartley

We had a significant reduction in sales this year over last year. This was primarily due to a significant increase in cost of raw product resulting from a major increase in beef and pork prices leading to our first price increase since we started this program some 14 years ago. For the most part sales were maintained when the reasons for the price increase were related to the market. Regardless our Herders managed to get within 55% of last year's totals. Through the combined efforts of Vitto Brand Meats, Joe Wilcox and others the overproduction was sold to Vitto accounts, Commercial accounts and individuals. As we look to the future to

maintain this worthwhile project alternate new buyers such as small to medium size businesses should be considered and pursued. I would be remiss if I did not extend my special thanks to Joe, Jerry and any others that picked up the slack for me this year and we thank everyone for their efforts this year and hope that a stabilized market will allow us to get back on course in 2015.
