Wizard's Computer Corner - Rob Rehill

What are these “drivers” I am hearing about and why do I need them to make stuff like my printer work?

Every device you plug into your computer (or access over a network) speaks its own “language” so in order for your computer to talk to these devices it requires a driver or “translator” so it can communicate back and forth with the device. It is important to note that an HP computer still can't speak to an HP printer without that driver, the HP printer still speaks its only language, and a very specific language. If it's an HP P1102W, it speaks “HP P1102W” and these same drivers cannot be used to allow your computer to communicate with a HP Officejet 6800, because the Officejet 6800 speaks “HP Officejet 8600.” These drivers act as the intermediary translator between your computer and the device. Just like in the real world, if you couldn't speak French, and wanted to talk to someone who does speak French, you would tell the translator, and the translator would tell the individual that speaks French, and that person would reply to the translator, who would relay the message to you. The same goes for the computer. The computer speaks to the “Officejet 8600” driver, and it speaks to the printer. And when the printer has something to say to the computer, it speaks to the driver, who then tells the computer the message.
