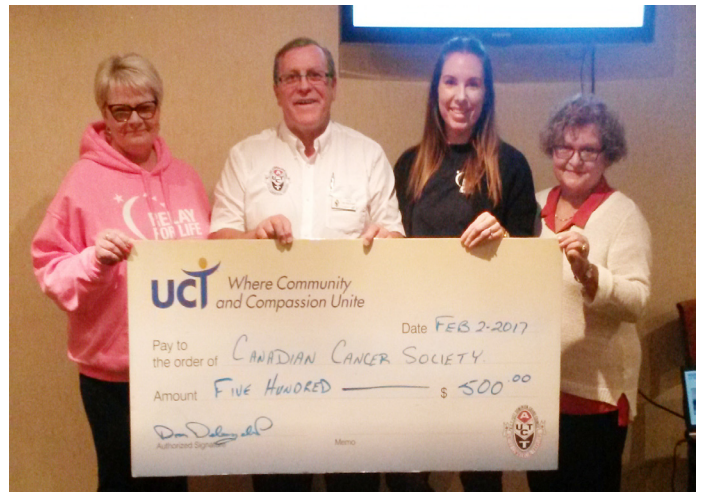
General Meeting – Gil Hartley
