Our guest speaker was Pastor Bradley Hale from the Elgin Street Mission. He presented some startling facts. Sudbury has given out 1,000,000 needles - that's right 1 million - this past year. On average 3 people a day overdose. That points to the fact Sudbury does have a drug problem.

The Mission serves all kinds, drug addicts, homeless, the elderly, people with mental health issues and some who are just hurting. Everyone is welcome. They come for the meals and the company. Usually they prep 250 meals a day. There are laundry facilities, showers and a clothing room that the patrons can access.
