Secretary's Report

On May 4, 2022, we had 23 members and 1 guest at our meeting. Spence Webster, representing the Manitoulin Children's Foundation was our guest speaker. He spoke to us about their Send a Kid to Camp Program. A 1983 study showed there were in excess of 1,300 children who could benefit from an outdoor experience each year. It would assist children in their

social, mental, physical, emotional, and spiritual life. It has given children a chance to meet new friends and enjoy the benefits of wholesome fun and just be kids. All children must be referred to the Send a Kid to Camp program. Children served in the program are between the ages of 5 and 14 and are: sexually, physically, mentally abused, or socially and financially disadvantaged. There are over 30 camps across Ontario that take these children. The testimonials from the children who attended were heart warming. In the 39 years in operation, they have sent 12,000 children to camps and over \$3,000,000.00 was spent locally on direct program fees. The average cost of sending one child to camp has increased from \$275 to \$600. 100% of all donations received are used directly for program fees for the children of the Sudbury Manitoulin District.

Don Delongchamp and Doug Honeyford proudly presented Spence Webster with a \$1000 for the Send a Kid to Camp program.
